




EFTA and EU Membership Evolution

EFTA and the EU 1960



Technical Assistance: Our Context

- IPA = Instrument for Pre-accession Assistance (from 1 January 2007).
- This EU program offers technical assistance to countries aspiring to join the EU.
- Policy area: Single Market.
- EFTA technical assistance involvement has a strong regional focus.

Quality Infrastructure



Refers to all aspects of metrology, standardisation, accreditation, market surveillance, testing, quality management, inspection and certification that have a bearing on conformity assessment. This includes public and private institutions and the regulatory framework within which they operate.




Technical Assistance in the Western Balkans

CARDS 2006 (2007-2008)

Overall Objective

Strengthen cooperation between quality infrastructure institutions in the Western Balkans



- Evaluation of state of quality infrastructure in each participating country to check progress made
- Regional proficiency testing schemes in priority sectors, each with targeted training
- Regional and sector based hands-on training based on the assessment findings
- Deepening of a regional network of quality infrastructure professionals



CARDS 2006 (2007-2008) - Achievements

A successful project, recognised both by the main project partners and by independent monitoring

<u>Highlights</u>

- One regional and seven national assessment reports with list of progress made in the preceding two years and recommendations.
- Ten hands-on training courses held in EU and EFTA. 79 delegates attended funded by the project. An unprecedented 39 additional delegates attended, funded by their own institutions.
- Positive outcome of a very ambitious proficiency testing exercise, with tests run simultaneously in eight priority areas. All countries in the Western Balkans participated with a total of 52 labs. 79 delegates, including representatives of all accreditation bodies in the region, joined the final training in Ljubljana.
- Encouraging network-building in the main quality infrastructure fields.




A Few Findings from the Inception Report Spring 2009

- Project timely and needed; welcomed by partners.
- Benefits far outweigh relatively modest budget.
- Regional cooperation is a vital component in pre-accession period.
- Poor coordination of QI initiatives between donor agencies and amongst beneficiaries.
- Further harmonisation in QI fields remains key.
